MAUNDY THURSDAY, MARCH 28th COMMUNION IN THE UPPER ROOM

Please come and join us in the celebration of the Last Supper. You may come any time between 4 - 6 p.m., receive scripture readings and spend time in prayer in the worship space. Groups of 10-12 will be called to receive Holy Communion in the Upper Room during this time.

GOOD FRIDAY TENEBRAE SERVICE FRIDAY, MARCH 29th, 7:00 p.m.

Tenebrae" is the Latin word meaning "darkness." The service of Tenebrae, as practiced in most Protestant Churches, is an adaptation of medieval Roman Catholic practices for each of the days of Holy Week dating back to the ninth century. For Protestants, this single service is typically held at night on Maundy Thursday or Good Friday.

It is a story of the suffering and death of Jesus from John's gospel and is divided into 16 readings. After each segment of the story is read, a candle is extinguished. After the fifteenth reading, which confirms that Jesus had died on the cross, the last of the 15 lit candles is extinguished or taken away, and a loud sound (called *strepitus* in Latin) is made to convey the sense of total loss of God's presence and the effect of the death of Jesus on the universe. The final story of the burial is read in near darkness. This is a very experiential service which will also include different types of music.

We will leave in silence to ponder the impact of Christ's death and await the celebration of the coming Resurrection.

NEW COMMUNITY OUTREACH OPPORTUNITY HERE AT GRACE CHURCH

Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) is a national program that provides nutrition counseling and supplemental food coupons to promote good health for pregnant women and gives infants and children up to age 5 a healthy start to life. The Stearns County program is primarily based in Waite Park but many of the participating families in the western part of the county have transportation barriers and are unable to get to the main office.

A WIC representative contacted us in January to see if we might have a room they could use once a month for WIC appointments. The Trustees and Leadership Teams unanimously voted "yes!"

WIC nutritionists started meeting with their clients on Tuesday, February 27th in the Fireside room and will continue holding appointments on the fourth Tuesday of each month from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

If you happen to see WIC participants or workers while you're here, please welcome them to Grace Church, and if you know of any low-income families that might benefit from WIC, let them know about the program! We'll have WIC brochures available (coming soon) at the Welcome Table or they can call 320-203-6942 for more information.


